

FRIENDS IN SERVICE HELPING From the Executive Director



We need help! Please help us correct the "rumor mill." Many people that I talk to about our Family Student Housing project in Carson City say, "Oh, I thought that was another homeless shelter," and, "What are you going to do with your other buildings in Carson." Please help us debunk any circulating myths with the details that follow.

For years, FISH has trained Medical students and Nursing students from UNR and Social Work students from several regional and online colleges. These students, our staff, and other volunteers help FISH provide services to the Quad Counties and beyond. We focus on stabilizing people going through a crisis, and then provide more resources to those that are willing to put in the work that it takes to change their habits and behaviors, so they can eventually change their lives. That's why we say it's "a hand-up not a hand-out."

About four years ago, we realized that Nevada had a talent shortage. Many high-paying jobs were going unfilled. Talent from other states could not find housing and locally we did not have folks that could fill jobs in healthcare, labor trades, IT, trucking, etc. So, we began meeting with government agencies, NNDA, WNC, and various non-profits to chart a course of action. We determined that we needed to find potential students with good academic skills, a good work history, and an interest in the jobs in our region that require more technical training.

FISH was the only one who was willing and able to take on the housing portion to help qualified candidates transition from "affordable/workforce" housing into our housing (initially at the Whistle Stop Inn, that we purchased). The students could then focus on getting the college-level technical training offered by WNC, the electrical union, various HVAC organizations, auto repair shops, etc. Following our pilot program, we found that 80% of those willing and able to qualify for training were single-parent families. Shortly after they were employed, using their technical studies, these families were able to afford more traditional housing in the area.

As a result, FISH began the construction of our Family Student Housing project near downtown Carson City, which should be ready for occupancy when Fall classes begin. Less than 1% of our current clients will qualify for this regional training effort. We have expanded our client base to those who are working multiple jobs in order to support their families. Our intention is to move them from "minimum wage to meaningful careers."

In summary, FISH is expanding its services and client base. We will continue to use our existing properties/ locations to provide services to our traditional clients and these students. We will provide training to all family members, not just the ones attending technical classes. After gaining employment in their new career field, we will develop individualized plans to gradually transition these families from our "dormitory" to more traditional permanent housing.

Anything that you can do to help support this regional project is greatly appreciated. Some may only be able to help correct the rumor mill. Others can provide financial assistance to the project or support FISH as a volunteer. "For the first time in over 20 years, I no longer feel pain. My happiness has returned and I feel my aura is light and free. Finally, I feel blessed."

Sergio Tejeda, a FISH client who recently received two dental extractions through the FISH dental assistance program exclaims his joy to FISH staff this past March 2023. Tejeda had been experiencing an uncomfortable pain that had lasted for over 20 years, led to high anxiety, low mental health, and a decrease in hope. That is until FISH was able to provide the oral care needed through local dental office partnerships.

Now, in his late 60's and a retired furniture maker in the High Sierra, Tejeda is currently staying at the FISH Focus House men's shelter and spends his days feeling joy and gratitude for his new found relief. "I was feeling so low after my dad passed away. We were due for a big frost last fall, so I had to rip out my whole garden. It was way more than my family could use. I made a call to your dining room, and was told in a very cheerful manner that they would be happy to have the produce. When I arrived, I was warmly greeted by two staff members. There were warm and welcoming smiles from the clients, as well. It made me feel loved on a very hard day. Thank you for your kindness!"

Laura: When I was dropped off at FISH in early 2022, I had no belongings; just an orange jumpsuit. FISH Wylie House took me in for a longer than standard period of time. I enjoyed volunteering extra hours in the food bank and now consider FISH my friends. My health and well-being has improved.

What challenges have you faced?


NM: Working with vulnerable populations was at first a challenge for me but I have enjoyed finding my comfort zone

The Snow Never Bothered Us Anyway



After a long unanticipated winter and numerous snow storms, construction is still making way at 1421 N. Carson Street in downtown Carson City. By Fall 2023, Family Student Housing Tower #1 will be open to 18 qualified low-income families/individuals who will take part in technical certifications at WNC and TMCC and make their way from poverty to prosperity through education. This will lead them to high-pay high-demand jobs in this region. Careers such as HVAC, IT, nursing, electrical, plumbing, construction manage-

ment, diesel mechanics and more. And when the kids see their parents doing the work, they'll be inspired to do the same.

This program is the first of its kind to be implemented by a non-profit organization in the state of Nevada. More than 90% of the funding for this project comes from the community members in support of the effort. No federal funding, minimal localized grants, and a whole lot of community.

Connecting with community members is our biggest focus with the new Family Student Housing project. Recently, from December to March, FISH conducted a matching campaign of \$250,000...and it was met! All donors who contributed to the matching campaign had their donation matched by an anonymous local donor, making the total amount raised \$500,000. And we aren't stopping there.

Those who would like to take part in this massive community project have the opportunity to sponsor a portion of the apartment towers and commercial building, which includes recognition and naming rights. Your involvement in this project means that fewer families in our community will need to rely on low-income housing in order to thrive. Rather, they will have stable, high-pay and high-demand, careers that will support themselves and their families.
